### **Oregon Shakespeare Festival's 2021 season – virtual options!**

Bay Area artists Steven Anthony Jones, Tim Bond and Erika Chong Shuch are part of the lineup in Ashland, a hybrid of digital and in-person performances. Bay Area fans of the Oregon Shakespeare Festival can enjoy the first section of the renowned theater company's 2021 season without having to make the trek to Ashland, OR. When the theater transitions from digital to in-person offerings, top Bay Area artists are also part of the lineup.

The season, announced Wednesday, Feb. 17, begins with recordings of shows from the 2017 and 2018 seasons. *Julius Caesar* (March 1 – 27) is directed by Shana Cooper and choreographed by the Bay Area's Erika Chong Shuch, bringing with it a fresh resonance after the Jan. 6 riots at the Capitol.

Up next are Mary Kathryn Nagle's *Manahatta* (March 29 – April 24), which makes connections between 17<sup>th</sup>-century and present-day oppression of Native Americans; and Frances Ya-Chu Cowhig's *Snow in Midsummer* (May 3 – 29), about a wrongfully convicted woman and the survivor who must clear her name. (The show re-envisioned the classical Chinese drama "The Injustice to Dou Yi That Moved Heaven and Earth.") Laurie Woolery and Justin Audibert, respectively, direct.

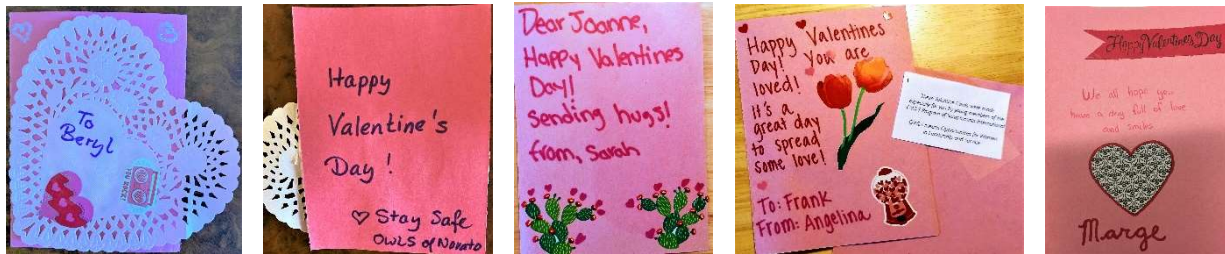
