

COVID-19 UPDATE

Yea! Those of us 75 and older, without computers or without reliable internet connection, can now call (833) 641–1988 to get assistance from a real live human being in scheduling COVID vaccinations. This phone line operates Monday through Friday, 8am to 5pm and is designed to help those do not have internet connectivity or an at-home computer, tablet, or smartphone. If you know of an older adult who does not have reliable internet access and has been unable to secure a vaccine appointment, please share this information with them.

Another yea! Vaccination data from nursing homes around the county clearly indicates that the vaccines are helping to prevent infections, and to reduce serious cases and deaths from COVID. So be sure to sign up for your own vaccination soon, if you haven't already. Hesitation doesn't help. Vaccination does!

And one more yea! We're back to the Red Tier! That's good progress, and cases in Marin, so far, are continuing to decline. Of course, it's no time to get complacent. Virus variations are potentially cause for concern, and continued protective actions, including more vaccinations, are needed before we can move further forward.

WHERE HAS ALL THE WATER GONE?

If it's not one thing, it's another. We are now in the early stages of another drought. According to Marin Water, 2020 was the second-driest year in the past 90! So start conserving water now. Here are a few simple things we all can do to help:

- Turn off outdoor irrigation systems unless you have a smart irrigation controller that automatically adjusts to weather and landscaping in delivering water
- Water by hand, but only 2 or 3 times a week
- Water plants outdoors only before 9am or after 7pm
- Install water-efficient fixtures--aerators on faucets and showers, a shutoff nozzle on your garden hose, etc.
- Turn off water when brushing your teeth
- Take shorter showers
- Check for drips and leaks and fix them as soon as you can
- Wash your car only at a car wash that uses recycled water
