Are you ready for fire season?

Advance planning is critical for a safe and orderly evacuation when a fire occurs in your area. Important steps to take if you haven't already:

- Sign up for alerts if you have a cell phone or voice over internet phone. Register with AlertMarin (www.alertmarin.org) and with Nixle (text your zip code to 888777). Note: landlines are already registered with AlertMarin.
- Check out the Get Ready Marin website for helpful information if you haven't already. https://readymarin.org/
- Create an emergency plan with your family or closest family friends so everyone knows where to meet up or where you will be if separated and what escape routes you have identified.

- Stay alert and ready to move when there are red flag warnings, and especially
 evacuation warnings. Obey evacuation orders and, if possible, leave when the warning
 is issued, rather than wait for an official order to evacuate. Tune in to local radio
 stations for up-to-date information.
- Keep your emergency kits and "go bags" where you can easily find them. Include a
 mask and bandana to help protect against smoke. Don't forget sturdy shoes and long
 pants and a jacket. Prepare pet carriers and pet food, if you have pets.
- Always keep your cell phone fully charged and your gas tank at least ½ full in case electricity is lost.
- Evacuate via car, rather than on foot. Only call 911 if you have no means of transportation and need to evacuate.
