## **COVID ALERT! MASK INDOORS!**

Well, it continues to be confusing about whether or not to wear masks and the news about rising numbers of COVID cases among the unvaccinated and even a few vaccinated individuals is concerning. Watch for updated information and guidance from Marin Villages periodically as we try to stay on top of everything. The last Marin Villages update was emailed to members

and volunteers on July 20, and noted that the seven Bay Area counties all recommend that masks be worn in public indoor spaces regardless of vaccination status.

In addition to supporting that recommendation, that email also requested that that Marin Villages members and volunteers wear masks when accepting/giving Marin Villages car rides or services provided in homes, as well as at indoor events/gatherings in private homes, unless it is certain that everyone present is fully vaccinated.

Today the State of California issued formal guidance which reflects the same advice about wearing masks in indoor public spaces. **8/10/21** – Community Circle #1 with business owners, their employees and community nonprofits

**8/24/21** – Community Circle #2 with faith-based groups of Tiburon

9/14/21 – Community Circle #3 with residents of Tiburon

**9/28/21** – Community Circle #4 with under-represented populations of Tiburon

## As if you could forget, fire season is here

Advance planning is critical for a safe and orderly evacuation when a fire occurs in any area. Here's a repeat of important steps to take if you haven't already:

- Sign up for alerts if you have a cell phone or voice over internet phone. Register with AlertMarin (<a href="www.alertmarin.org">www.alertmarin.org</a>) and with Nixle (text your zip code to 888777). Note: landlines are already registered with AlertMarin.
- Check out the Ready Marin website for helpful information if you haven't already. https://readymarin.org/
- Create an emergency plan with your family or closest family friends so everyone knows where to meet up or where you will be if separated, and what escape routes you have identified.
- Keep your emergency kits and "go bags" where you can easily find them. Include a
  mask and bandana to help protect against smoke. Don't forget sturdy shoes and long
  pants and a jacket. Prepare pet carriers and pet food, if you have pets.

- Always keep your cell phone fully charged and your gas tank at least ½ full in case electricity is lost.
- Evacuate via car, rather than on foot. Only call 911 if you have no means of transportation and need to evacuate.
