COVID alert!

The CDC is recommending that you get a booster shot if you meet these criteria:

- you are 65 or older, or
- you are 50-64 years old and you have underlying medical conditions, or
- you live in an assisted living facility and
- you received the Pfizer vaccine shots at least 6 months ago.

Boosters are NOT yet recommended for those who received the Moderna or Johnson & Johnson vaccines.

To schedule a booster, try your healthcare provider first, but after that, if you need help with scheduling or need a ride to a location where the boosters are given, call the office. Boosters are pretty readily available at many pharmacies in Marin. If you can't leave your house because of mobility, fragility, or other concerns, call the office for assistance. It may be possible to receive your booster at home from one of the mobile assist units. (415) 457-4633

Also remember that Marin Villages is requesting that members and volunteers wear masks when accepting/giving Marin Villages car rides or services provided in homes, as well as at indoor events/gatherings in private homes **unless it is certain that everyone present is fully vaccinated**. How about this little déjà vu reminder from the time of the Spanish Flu? If you can't read the sign on the coat at the far right, it says *Wear a mask or go to jail*! A bit stronger than our message, but nonetheless a good reminder of the importance of wearing masks!

And remember, actually prepare, don't just think about it!

- Sign up your cell phone for fire and other disaster alerts with AlertMarin (www.alertmarin.org) and with Nixle (text your zip code to 888777). Note that landlines are already registered with AlertMarin.
- Make sure your family or closest friends know where to meet up or where you will be if separated and what escape routes you have identified
- Keep your emergency kits and "go bags" where you can easily find them. Include a mask and bandana to help protect against smoke. Don't forget sturdy shoes and long pants and a jacket. Prepare pet carriers and pet food, if you have pets.
- Keep that cell phone fully charged and your gas tank at least ½ full


Apropos of our mini Tiburon Peninsula heatwave in September..
