Directions: From Hwy 101 in San Rafael, take the exit for Smith Ranch Rd east approximately 0.7 miles. Follow Smith Ranch Rd 0.8 miles to treatment facility. Park on the left. There are 10 parking spaces; however, this is a popular walk so carpooling is recommended. Also, traffic on Hwy 101 south from Novato to Smith Ranch Rd may be heavy at 9:00am so please leave enough time to get to the start of the walk by 9:30am.
